ABOUT US

The Lawrence S. Ting Foundation (LSTF) was established in 2005 as a local non-profit and non-governmental organization in Vietnam. To date, LSTF has supported over 2 million disadvantaged individuals nationwide. The Foundation primarily provides services and assistance in education and healthcare for those in need. Its key activities include scholarships and life skills training for disadvantaged students, IT equipment provision for schools, capacity building for teachers, and wheelchair donations for people with disabilities. The Our Better Angels project (*Vietnamese name: Thiên Thần Chậm Bước*) is an initiative launched by LSTF to improve the quality of education for children with disabilities. Initially, we focus on supporting 1,000 children with disabilities in the Mekong Delta region, with plans to expand to other areas.

Each child is an angel who enters this world to complete the picture of life. Children with disabilities, with their uniqueness, are lovingly called "Slow-Stepping Angels" (Thiên Thần Chậm Bước). Though they may take slower steps, they persistently move forward toward a brighter future. Each child nurtures their own dreams and aspirations, yet to make those dreams a reality, they require motivation and substantial support from all of us.

To achieve this goal, LSTF has been implementing various activities such as enhancing the quality of teachers, building digital learning environments for children with disabilities, and raising awareness among caregivers. As part of these efforts, we seek the support of volunteers to develop supplementary learning materials, further strengthening the digital learning environment for children with disabilities.
